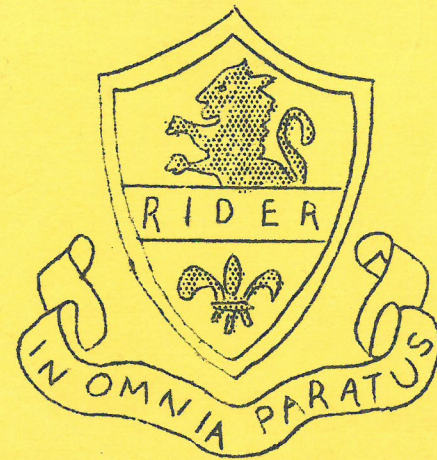

## OUTLOOK FOR 1959

Although coach Frank Donlon's charges have lost their top scorer of 1958, an All-American on defense and a talented playmaker, the outlook for this season is surprisingly better.

According to Donlon, Rider will be a better balanced squad this year with the acquisition of three talented freshmen and a surplus of experienced veterans.

Said Donlon, "although we are facing just as tough a schedule this year, I feel that we will not only better last year's mark but should have a winning season in 1959."

Rider will host practically the same schedule as last year with the exception of Wilkes College.

## THUMBNAILS

His 17th season....

This fall will mark Frank Donlon's 17th year as soccer coach at Rider.

During his stay here, coach Donlon has established a fine 62 wins-34 losses-11 ties record. He has coached all but three years (1940-42) of Rider College soccer since its inception in 1933.

An excellent coach, Donlon was just as good as a player. During his undergraduate days, he accumulated 11 varsity letters, participating in track, basketball, baseball and football.

In track, Donlon was a two-time winner of the Middle Atlantic States A.A.U. 100-yard dash in 1928 and 1929.

The dean of coaches at Rider came to Trenton in 1932 and held the position of Director of Athletics here for some time.

Those who bear watching in '59.....

LEN MATYSEK...A speedy center forward, this Trenton resident scored seven goals last season. An alert player and bulwark of Donlon's attack, much will be expected of this junior in '59.

EDDIE PARRISH...Another speed demon, Parrish also dented the scoring column last year, hitting the nets for three goals from his inside right berth. A junior from Mattituck, Long Island, Parrish's blazing speed and quick movements will make him a constant threat to the opposition this season.

RON MATLACK...A talented outside right in his junior year at Rider, Matlack also scored in '58. It is Donlon's hope that the experience gained last year by Matlack will make him even more dangerous this fall.

TONY MIKOVSKY...A standout on defense last year although he was overshadowed by All-American Frank Nerwinski, was Trenton's Tony Mikovsky. Many a threat by the opposition was stopped by this rugged halfback who enters his last year for the Roughriders this fall.

FRANK HICKMAN...Needless to say, no team can succeed without a competent goalie, and this Frank Hickman is. Throughout his three years of varsity play, Hickman has won constant praise from coach Donlon.

CHARLES FARRAUTO...Leading the sophomore talent this year is a five foot-eight inch inside forward known around campus as "Ping-Pong." According to Donlon, Farrauto could have nailed down a varsity position with no trouble at all last year. Said the Rider mentor, "Farrauto should score at least ten goals this year."

JULES CHMIELEWSKI...Another talented sophomore this season is halfback Chmielewski, an All-State Stater in his high school days at Trenton Catholic. It is hoped that this newcomer might fill the shoes of All-American Nerwinski who has since graduated.

DON KUBICKO...One of Long Island's most valuable high school soccer players of a few seasons ago is this speedster from Smithtown. Kubicko is the third sophomore coach Donlon is counting on heavily when Rider opens its 1959 soccer season October 7th against Lincoln University.

In his first year of coaching at Rider this year will be freshman soccer and basketball mentor Glen C. Leach.

A graduate of Paterson State Teachers College, Leach comes to Rider from Manasquan High School where he was assistant basketball and football coach.

Leach also coached basketball at Fairlawn (NJ) High School, St. Joseph's of Paterson High School and Paterson-Rutgers College.

At Fairlawn, his court squads recorded a better-than .700 winning percentage, while in his last year at St. Joseph's, his team finished second in Bergen-Passaic Parochial League play. His Paterson-Rutgers combine ended 5-10 in his lone try at college tutoring.

Another new face...

Another newcomer to the Rider sports scene is Alex Chmielewski, soccer trainer for the college.

Alex, up to a few years ago, was one of Trenton's top soccer players and has played with nearly every team in the American Soccer League.

He is a member of the famous Highlander eleven that won the National Cup a number of years ago and has also played in numerous international soccer matches.

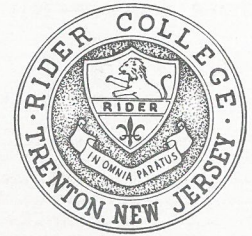

**THE COACHES**

New Coach of Rider Soccer forces this Fall is young, talented Glenn C. Leach, freshman soccer mentor here for the past two seasons.

Leach, who is also head basketball coach at Rider, replaces long-time sports personality Frank Donlon, guider of Roughrider soccer teams for the past 18 campaigns.

Chairman of the Physical Education Department at Rider, Leach is presently completing the requirements for his doctorate degree in physical education from New York University.

A 33-year old U. S. Marine Corps veteran, Leach is married and the father of three daughters.

\*\*\*\*\*

Slated to handle the freshman soccer squad for the first time this season is 28 year-old Joseph J. Ritter, who is also the trainer at Rider.

Active in football and baseball, Ritter also played quite a bit of outside soccer while an undergraduate at West Chester (Pa.) State College.

The recipient of a diploma in physical therapy from the University of Pennsylvania, Ritter is now attempting his master's degree in physical education at Southern Methodist University. A veteran of the U. S. Army, he is also married.

**PROSPECTUS**

Embarking upon his first year at the helm of Rider soccer, Coach Leach has at his disposal a squad strong in defense and offering a dangerous scoring punch.

The acquisition of some talented sophomores plus the return of 12 lettermen has made possible Leach's present situation.

However, even though the youthful mentor is knee deep in talent, he is still not that optimistic about the coming season.

"We lost two good scorers in Len (32 goals in three years) Matysek and Ed (16 goals last year) Parrish through graduation and another potential star in junior Frank Wirth, sidelined because of grade trouble," said Leach. He added that one just doesn't go through a season without feeling the loss of three such fine players.

Leach, nevertheless did concede that things at Rider should be better this season than in the past few years. To support his beliefs he pointed out the return of All-American hopeful Charles Farrauto (pictured on front cover) in the line and the appearance of newcomers Ed Glover at wing and John Dick and Tom Galan in the backfield. Leach also disclosed that this Fall, for the first time in many years, Rider will be three deep in the goalie position.

An overall look at the coming season should find the Roughriders equalling if not breaking last year's mark of 5-5, not quite as powerful on the offense but definitely a lot stronger on defense.

Out front, the Broncs look good with plenty of capable, experienced linemen, plus highly regarded soph John Taweel. Christofides, Balaziuk, Doey and Beaney all have the ability to lead the team in scoring.

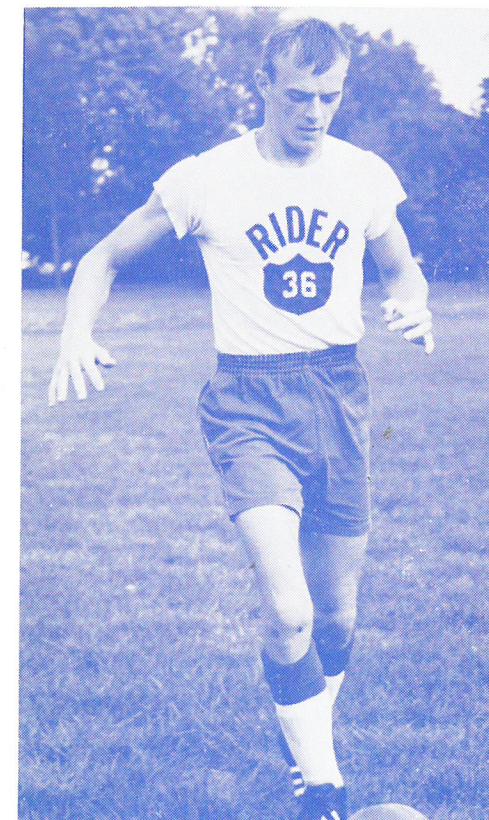

## CROSS COUNTRY OUTLOOK

Maybe it was the old sophomore jinx. Whatever it was, Rider's second year of varsity cross country was marked by misfortunes that helped produce a disappointing 4-6 duel meet record.

Coach Frank Greenberg has departed, leaving the Bronc harriers in the hands of Athletic Director John Carpenter. Carpenter coached the sport for a couple years at Gettysburg but says the role at Rider is only temporary.

Two factors give the interim coach cause for optimism. One is the return of several veterans including junior standout Lee Mallory (right) and senior Rich Baitzel. Secondly, Rider runners will be touring a home course extended from 4.2 miles to the more standard five miles.

Mallory set a new home course record of 20.38 in 1967 and led Rider to a fifth place finish in the New Jersey college championships. He later finished 20th in a field of 400 in the NCAA meet in Illinois, missing an All-America team berth by just nine seconds. Rider's hopes for an MAC championship were shattered, however, when Mallory and Baitzel both came up with back injuries and the regular number two man was lost to the squad.

Lettermen Jim Ross, Jack Way and Charles Weigley also figure in the Bronc scheme along with a promising group of runners up from a frosh squad that was 4-1. St. Joseph's and Lafayette are newcomers to the schedule.

## FALL BASEBALL

With Fall becoming for college baseball what Spring is for college football, Rider coach Tom Petroff was preparing to look at a couple dozen prospects during the informal Autumn campaign.

Petroff was faced with the task of replacing the entire infield from the 1968 team which compiled a 19-6 record.

Rich Giallella is playing soccer but Don Klinger, who blossomed in left is back and may be tried as a catcher. The pitching staff appears to be the soundest spot with veterans Lane Cyphers and Scott Gordon, transfer Ernie Szeker and soph Larry Nickol counted on as the nucleus.

A number of highly promising freshmen also will be watched closely. Last Fall, the Bronc batters posted a 9-2 record. There is no set schedule.

**JOSEPH J. RITTER**

Slowly but steadily, Joe Ritter has been realizing his goal of making Rider an Eastern soccer power.

Going into his seventh year as Bronc coach, Ritter had compiled an overall record of 38-39-3. A fairer measure of the improvement in Rider soccer, however, is the past three seasons which have resulted in 24 wins and three ties against just 13 defeats.

A Philadelphia native, 35-year-old Ritter graduated from West Chester State College where he played baseball and football. He's also played service ball and independent soccer. At Rider, Ritter doubles as the athletic trainer.

### SOCCER OUTLOOK

That look on the face of Rider soccer coach Joe Ritter could be defined as one of concern or consternation.

It was a prevalent thing a year ago as the Bronc booters struggled through a rebuilding season and wound up with a 6-7-1 log. The 1968 season should bring a smile back to the Ritter countenance. In fact it could be the most successful of Ritter's seven years at Rider.

Graduation claimed only one regular, goalie Howie Garchick. No less than 11 lettermen were due to report back including Rich Giallella, (top left) who won all-Middle Atlantic Conference honors as a sophomore and last year as a lineman led the team scorers with 16 goals. Eight veterans will be playing their third season with the Broncs.

Giallella's potent toe probably will remain on the line with veteran back Klaus Hilgers ticketed for net duties. He's also had experience there.

Bob Rostron (13 goals in two years) Mark Jacobs, the 1967 assist leader, Mike Howard (#51 on cover) and Orest Nadruga head the list of front line returnees. Gary Zarrilli, John Prunetti, Ron Schram and Steve Picco provide backfield experience. Rostron and Joe Cohen can play either end of the field while lineman Bob Doan is a transfer with impressive credentials.

Zarrilli and Rich Borland, a soph given a good chance of cracking the starting lineup, give both bulk and speed to the backfield. George Caruso and Frank Fratarcangeli also have starter potential. Rider's 14-game schedule includes 10 MAC contests. Gettysburg is the sole newcomer. Ray Haesler will take over the frosh booters. He'll be aided by Sgt. William Rommal.

## CROSS COUNTRY OUTLOOK

Rider's cross country team in 1968 was literally never in the running.

Stymied by scholastic ineligibility rulings, injuries and defections by regulars, interim coach John Carpenter recruited runners from the Bronc basketball and baseball teams. The team wound up 0-12 and only senior captain Rich Baitzel provided steady, good timings.

Rider's cross country fortunes should do a complete about face this fall.

New coach Ray Kressler brings with him to Rider an impressive high school coaching record. His enthusiasm already is rubbing off and a record number of runners were expected to be vying for spots on the squad.

Senior Lee Mallory apparently is eligible to compete after sitting out the 1968 season and Kressler is hoping he'll be able to regain the form that earned a 20th place finish in the 1967 NCAA small college championship meet.

Letterman Jack Way also returns but, otherwise, Kressler will be depending mainly on newcomers to spur a resurgence in the 4th season of cross country at Rider.

Freshmen rated highly by Kressler include Tony Galbicka and John Scheiner.

Rider will face 13 opponents in three dual meets and five double dual meets. Only two of the meets will be run on the Broncs' home course, newly extended to the standard five miles and realigned to include the Centennial Lake area. Competing for the first time, a freshman team will participate in a pair of double dual meets.

## FALL BASEBALL

With freshmen eligible for varsity ball for the first time, Rider coach Tom Petroff will have his hands full looking over prospects during the informal fall campaign.

A number of weekend doubleheaders plus an appearance in the Long Island Invitational Tournament September 19-21 along with St. John's, Rutgers and LIU should give Petroff a good line on what to expect from the Broncs next spring.

No less than 14 veterans are due back along with several promising players up from the 1968 freshman team. The pitching staff will bear watching. Veterans Rich Sokolowski, Scott Gordon and Larry Nickol will be joined by lefties Bob Albert and Mike Beane, who weren't able to play last spring, sophomore Mike Bahnick and at least two highly regarded freshmen. Righthander Ernie Szeker was expected to play soccer.



### RAY KRESSLER

Ray Kressler is a little guy with big ideas.

The man tabbed to revitalize Rider's cross country program and restore its track program after a 20-year absence, says he's aiming to put track at the college on a par with baseball and basketball.

If enthusiasm and past records are a valid criteria for measuring potential success, Kressler will realize his goal.

The 30-year-old native of Pennsylvania's Lehigh Valley comes to Rider after having brought a Wilkes Barre high school program from virtual obscurity to one of the state's best. His dual meet winning streak had reached 63 over seven seasons.

A graduate of East Stroudsburg State College, Kressler did graduate work at San Jose State College. He's served as president of the Pennsylvania Track and Field Association.

Kressler also is an ex-marathon runner so he knows what distance running is all about.

Look for cross country at Rider to get quickly back on the right track.

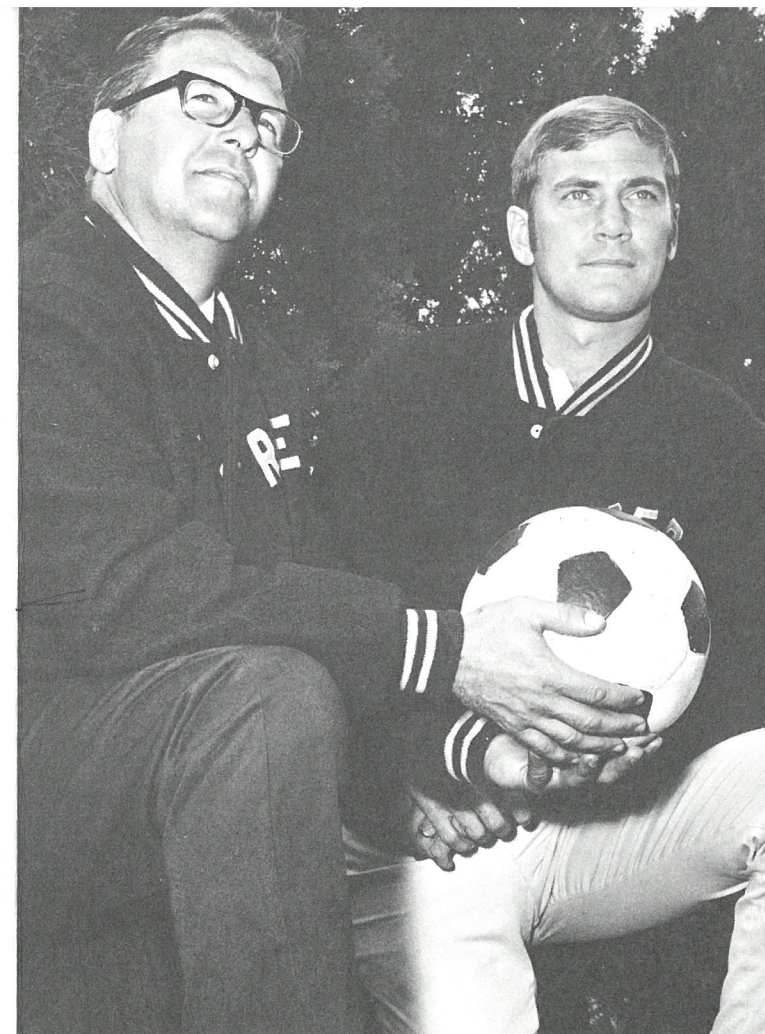

BOB PIVOVARNIC AND LEE COOK

Rider's soccer fortunes rest in new but highly capable hands following the surprise resignation of veteran coach Joe Ritter.

Head varsity coach Michael "Bob" Pivovarnick returns to his alma mater with impressive credentials, having developed Steinert High in nearby Hamilton Township into one of the state's top soccer powerhouses.

The new Bronc coach will be aided by Lee Cook, a 25-year-old former four-time All-American soccer player at Trenton State College.

Pivovarnick, 40, was a baseball and soccer standout at Rider during the mid-1950's and was the leading Bronc scorer in his senior year. He received both bachelor of science and master's degrees in education from Rider.

Soccer coach at Steinert since the school opened in 1956, Pivovarnick's teams have been consistent winners. The Spartans were conference champs four of the past five seasons and in 1967 shared the state Group IV title. Pivovarnick recorded his 100th victory during the past season.

Cook, who was captain of Trenton State's NAIA national championship teams in 1965 and 1966, earned his bachelor of arts degree in physical education from Humboldt State College in California.

1969 SOCCER OUTLOOK

A new playing field, two new coaches, a newly revised schedule and a large crop of new faces are all part of the 1969 soccer scene at Rider.

Nine regulars, including all-MAC lineman Rich Giallella (#24 on cover) all-conference backs Bob Rostron and Gary Zarrilli and all-MAC goalie Klaus Hilgers have departed. Giallella, particularly, will be missed. He set a new three-year varsity record with his 33 goals and did yeoman work as a part-time goalie.

The 40 goals scored by the 1968 Broncs came within two of the all time season scoring record set in 1959. They allowed but 14 goals.

New coach Bob Pivovarnick's hopes of matching last year's 10-3-1 mark are based on a potentially powerful defensive back line anchored by lanky Rich Borland, a standout in his first varsity season. Bo Hitchcock, a Marine Corps vet who played varsity soccer at Duke, probably will be the other fullback. He's also 6-4.

Sophomore Joe Schneid also lends strength to the backfield. Junior Al Roth is the apparent heir to Hilgers as Bronc net minder, although baseball catcher Paul Lewthwaite is a possibility.

The questionable area is the front line where the only returning regular is junior Frank Fratarcangeli who contributed five goals and four assists as a soph. Senior John Prunetti saw duty mainly as a halfback but also can play up front.

Pivovarnick is no stranger to some of his players. Borland and Fratarcangeli both played for him at Steinert High. Bob Smith and Mike Stricklin are freshmen from Steinert who could win starting berths.

Pat Budd, Pete Hook, Denis Gallagher, Dale Bertelsen and Jim Goodwin are letter winners who saw part time action last year. Baseball pitcher Ernie Szeker and freshman Joe Monteleone also may find sports in the lineup.

The controversial MAC rule on freshman eligibility will create some personnel shuffling problems for Pivovarnick. Freshmen will be permitted to play in nine games but will be restricted from games with the five other MAC Western Division schools.

Division foe Lehigh is on the schedule for the first time while division rivals Delaware, Bucknell and Lafayette return to the schedule after a long absence. Rider and Delaware will be renewing a rivalry that dates back to 1933, the Broncs' first year of varsity competition.

Elizabethtown, Fairleigh Dickinson, Rutgers, Hofstra, Temple and St. Joseph's help make the schedule a rugged one. All home games will be played on a field at the western end of the campus.

Rider's junior varsity-freshman team will be handled by Lee Cook.
