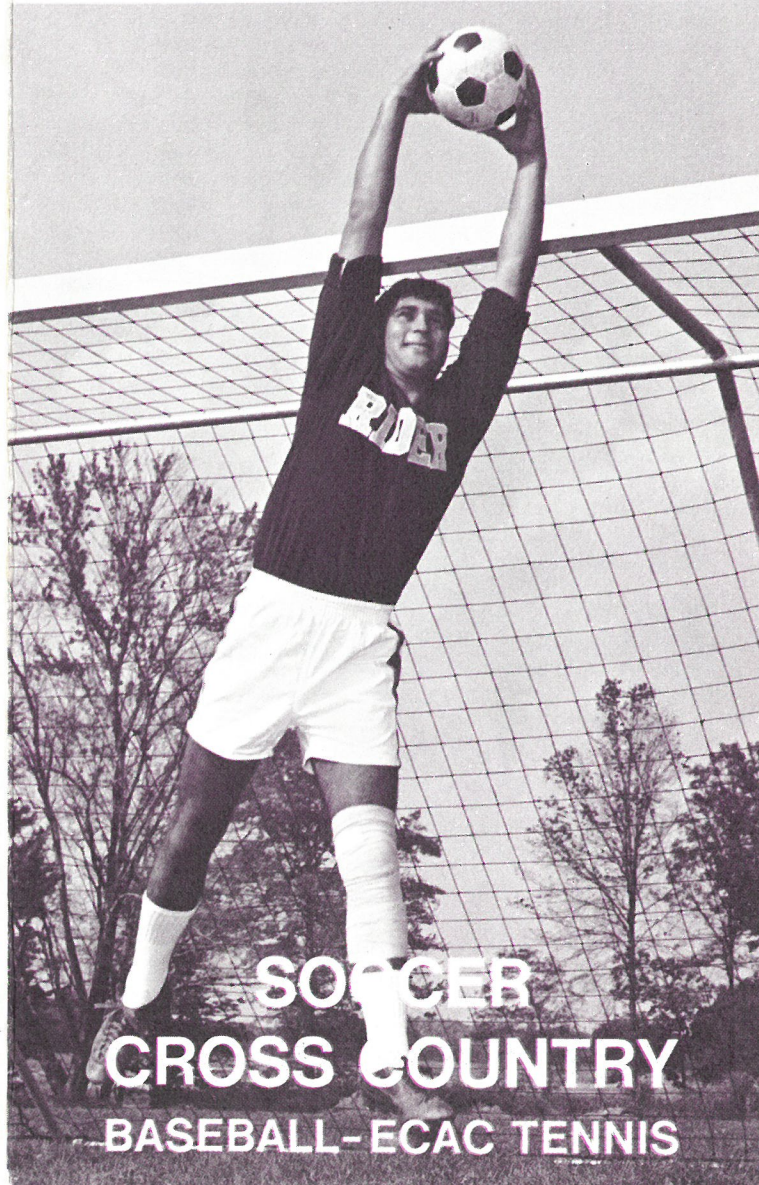

**BOB PIVOVARNICK**

Bob Pivovarnick's first season as varsity coach was one in which he got to know as many doctors as soccer players.

No less than seven regulars were knocked out of action during a season in which the Broncs struggled to a 4-8-2 record.

It was particularly tough for Pivovarnick, who has known nothing but success in 13 years of coaching.

The 41-year-old former baseball and soccer standout at Rider—he was leading Bronc scorer in his senior year—produced consistent winning teams at Steinert High School. His Spartans were conference champions in four of his last five seasons and shared the state Group IV title in 1967. He recorded his 100th scholastic victory in 1968.

Four prime examples of Pivovarnick's coaching talents can be seen in Rider uniforms this fall. Goalie Bill Povia, fullback ace Rich Borland, high scoring Bob Smith and freshman halfback Wayne Mahan all played for Pivovarnick at Steinert.

Assistant coach Lee Cook is a former four-time All-America soccer player at Trenton State. He was captain of Trenton State's NAIA national championship teams in 1965 and 1966 and earned his bachelor of arts degree from Humboldt State College in California.

## 1970 SOCCER OUTLOOK

A strong defense anchored by all-America candidate Rich Borland, more overall experience and a promising freshman crop give Rider high hopes of rebounding from a disappointing 1969 season.

The task will be tough as the Bronc booters will be playing probably their toughest schedule ever, starting at the top on Sept. 21 with a home game against NCAA champion St. Louis University.

Second-year coach Bob Pivovarnick will be depending heavily on Borland and veteran fullback mates Joe Schneid and Ernie Szeker. The goal also is in capable hands with letterman Bill Povia (on cover) returning along with alternate Al Roth. Both are experienced seniors and Pivovarnick ranks Povia one of the Middle Atlantic Conference's best. He was credited with 135 saves and recorded two shutouts during the 1969 season.

Borland, captain of the 1970 club, played steady ball despite a succession of painful injuries.

"He played with injuries that would have sidelined most other players. He gives 100 percent. He's a legitimate all-American," says Pivovarnick. Junior Schneid will be team co-captain.

The questionable area is again up front where the only returning regulars are sophomores Bob Smith and Bill Happersett. Smith shared the team scoring leadership last fall with six goals. Happersett had five.

Military service claimed veteran Frank Fratarcangeli and halfback Pat Budd transferred but Pivovarnick has back a number of part time performers including the Gallagher brothers, Denis and Kevin, juniors Dave Secrist and Pete Daly and sophomores John Elkins, Rich Coles and Steve Roomet.

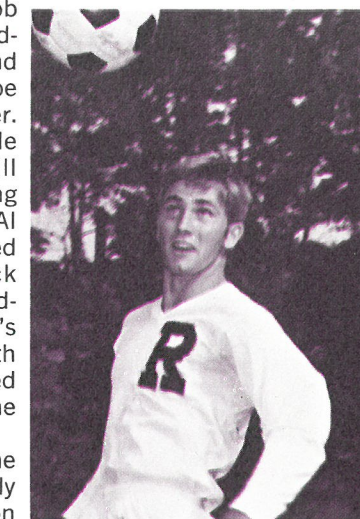
At least four of the incoming freshmen are rated as potential starters and Pivovarnick says there's a strong possibility he may go with an all freshman halfback trio.

The highly touted newcomers are Wayne Mahan, who played for Pivovarnick at Steinert High two years ago, Romeo Remigio, fullback on a Hackensack High team that tied with Steinert last fall for the New Jersey Group IV championship and Mark Kern from nearby Ewing High.

Among the other freshmen who may make it as regulars are back Mandje Ivanchukov and speedy lineman Terry Bodiford.

"We're going to be stronger and we should have a better ball handling team," says Pivovarnick. "It may take us a few games to jell but we have a good nucleus."

The revised MAC ruling will permit the use of freshmen in conference games for the first time. Rider also will field a jayvee team.

### 1971 CROSS COUNTRY OUTLOOK

Rider's cross country program should be back on the right course this year after three consecutive frustrating, talent-shy seasons. Third year coach Ray Kressler has assembled the most impressive array of talent since the sport was initiated at Rider and says he expects the Broncs to move up into the challenger class this fall.

"We've had to struggle but we're starting to make great strides," says Kressler. "We're still not quite up to a lot of teams we face but we'll be able to compete with a lot more teams this year."

Kressler feels he has a trio of runners who could be top performers for the Broncs. Right now, the number one man is Bob Honeywell, a junior who ran for Kressler in high school at Wilkes-Barre and who transferred to Rider from the Air Force Academy. He set two and three-mile records for the Broncs last spring.

Another of Kressler's high school runners, Cliff Robbins, should be ready after returning from a tour of duty with the Marine Corps in Vietnam. Third member of the big three is sophomore Gary Bushelli (Nanticoke, Pa.) top runner for the Broncs last fall.

A trio of freshmen also figure prominently in Kressler's plans. Bob Whiteman from Asbury Park has run the mile in 4:21 while Paul Brady from Essex Catholic was New Jersey state champion in the steeplechase. Kressler also has high regard for Charles Barker of Abington, Pa.

Depth on the squad will come from veterans Greg Hueston (Colonia, N.J.), Duke Altman (Willingboro, N.J.) and Gary Klueber (Union, N.J.) and freshman Jim Henry (Morrisville, Pa.).

Rider will be facing 17 opponents in 12 meets including six on the Broncs' five-mile home course, realigned a year ago to include a circuit of Centennial Lake. Cornell, Montclair State, Glassboro and Drew are newcomers to the schedule.

### RAY KRESSLER

Around Rider, they call Ray Kressler the "road runner" and not without good reason. Colleagues who see Kressler on Monday aren't really surprised anymore when on Thursday they get a card from him postmarked "San Francisco" or "Houston" or "Mexico City" or "Paris". The man gets around.

Kressler also has things moving on campus. Not only has he built the college's track program from scratch but he's made Rider's all-weather track facility the scene of all-comer meets, decathlons and steeplechase meets and clinics that have attracted hundreds of competitors from all over the East. Rider hosted the New Jersey Track Championships last spring and the track will be the site next spring of the Middle Atlantic Conference championships.

The 32-year-old Lehigh Valley native came to Rider after coaching Meyers High School of Wilkes-Barre, Pa. to 63 consecutive dual meet victories over seven seasons. Also an ex-marathon runner, Kressler graduated from East Stroudsburg State College and did his graduate work at San Jose State College.

At Rider, Kressler pumped enough desire and determination into his small first year track squad to produce four wins in the Broncs' first year of formal varsity competition two years ago. And last year the Broncs posted five victories while breaking almost every school track record.

Now Kressler is hoping that the same sort of spark will help produce a successful cross country season.

### FALL BASEBALL AND TENNIS

Up to 16 informal baseball games and the annual ECAC Division II Tennis Tournament will be extra attractions on the fall calendar. Coach Sonny Pittaro's baseball squad has included among its home games doubleheaders September 18 with St. Joseph's and October 2 with Lafayette.

As many as 40 colleges will be competing in the tennis tourney at Rider October 1-3. Coach Bob Kilgus' Bronc netmen finished second a year ago.

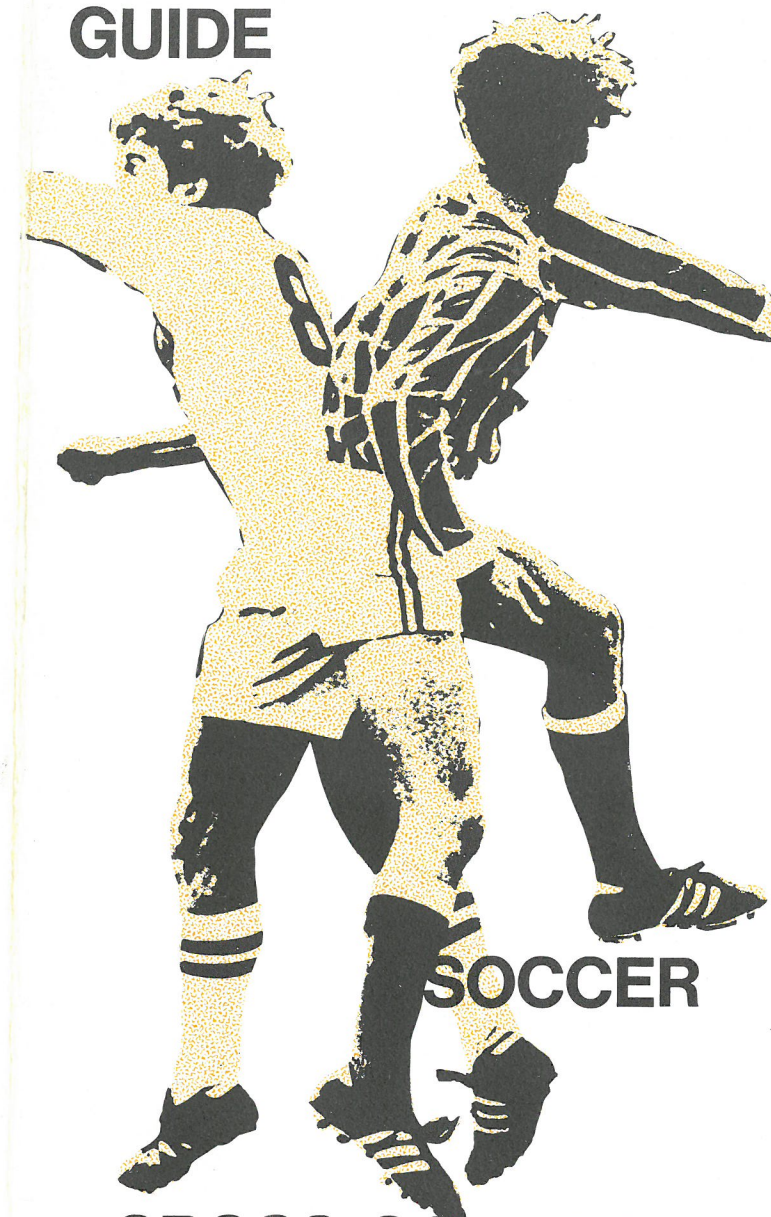

The association of the college and Hamilton Township's Steinert High School has been a fruitful one. The high school not only has produced standout soccer, baseball and basketball players for the Broncos but has given Rider its varsity soccer coach.

Michael "Bob" Pivovarnick came over to Rider from Steinert two seasons ago to rebuild the Broncos to a point where he feels they can challenge for 1971 Middle Atlantic Conference honors. At Steinert where he still serves as a guidance counselor, Pivovarnick turned out consistent winners over a dozen seasons. His Spartans were area conference champions in four of his last five seasons and shared the State Group IV title in 1967. He recorded his 100th scholastic victory in 1968.

Among Pivovarnick's former Steinert players are All-MAC goalie Bill Povia and All-Conference fullback Rich Borland from the 1970 Broncos and seven members of the 1971 Bronc varsity including All-America candidate Bob Smith.

Actually the exchange with Steinert was a fair one as Pivovarnick joined the staff there after graduating from Rider where he was a standout in both baseball and soccer, leading the Bronc booters in scoring in his senior year.

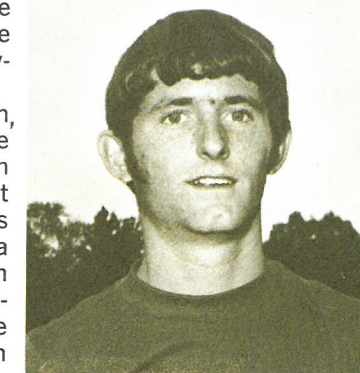

## 1971 SOCCER OUTLOOK

Bob Pivovarnick's third year as Rider coach promises to be his most successful despite the loss of all but four regulars from the 1970 squad.

Bob Smith is back and you can't ask for a much better player to build around. As a sophomore, Smith came within just one goal of equalling Ed Parrish's 10-year old single season scoring record of 16 goals. He's also within just 13 goals of setting a Rider career scoring mark. A quick, clever ball handler, Smith's performance was all the more impressive because he spent some of his playing time at halfback.

Pivovarnick feels Smith, who spent part of the summer playing soccer in Europe, is among the best in the East and also labels him a bonafide All-America candidate. He'll co-captain the Broncs along with veteran senior fullback Joe Schneid (Photo left with Pivovarnick).



All-conference goalie Bill Povia was expected to concentrate on baseball this fall but fortunately Pivovarnick has a capable replacement in senior Bob LoMauro. A transfer from Mitchell Junior College, LoMauro started on the line a year ago but was hobbled most of the season with injuries.

Transfers, military service returnees and promising freshmen combine with a sprinkling of varsity veterans to give Pivovarnick his optimistic outlook.

The top transfers are back Steve Kerner, a standout for the Mercer County Community College team and MVP in the National Junior College Tournament last year, and halfback Roger Rossano, a second team junior college All-America choice from Atlantic Community College.

Two-year regular Frank Fratarcangeli returns after an Army tour of duty while Mike Stricklin, who played with Smith at Steinert High, has enrolled as a freshman after a Marine hitch. Other veterans who could help are former letterman Pete Daly and fullback Basan Stepenow, a former New Jersey Scholastic standout.

Fullback Mandje Ivanchukov was a regular as a freshman and senior Kevin Gallagher, junior John Elkins and sophomores Tony Vitale, Jack McKiernan and Mark Kern all saw enough service to win varsity letters.

Among the top first year men are Drew Hires, a lineman who won all-area honors in South Jersey last year, small but speedy lineman Phil Mandara, a N.J. all-stater as a junior, and Ray Fumo. Junior Bill Veres was expected to help bolster the line.

"It may take us a couple of games to get going but we should have the talent," says Pivovarnick. "We also should have good team balance and if we can stay healthy, I feel we have a good chance to win the Middle Atlantic Conference."

The Broncs a year ago started slowly but came on to win or tie in six of their final seven games.

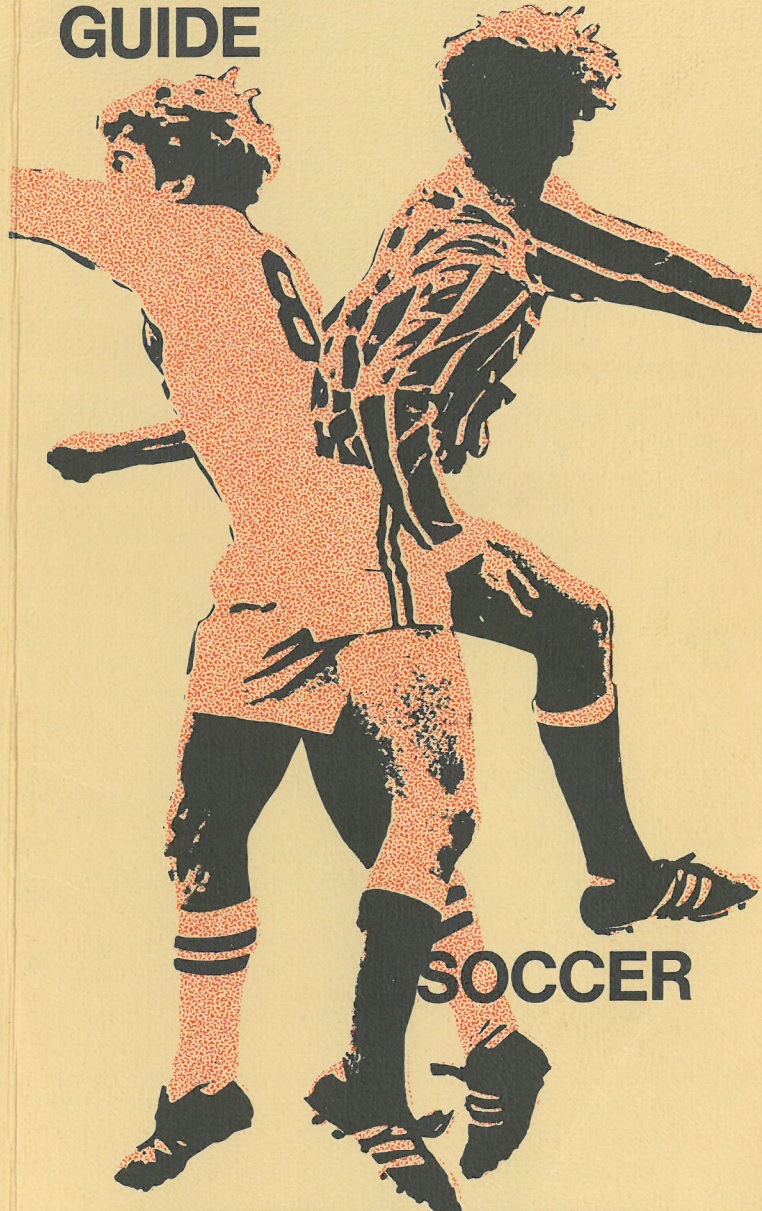

## BOB PIVOVARNICK

Michael "Bob" Pivovarnick, 43-year-old head soccer coach at Rider College, is a native of Hamilton Township, N.J. and a graduate of Hamilton High School. An alumnus of Rider, where he earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees, he starred as an outfielder on the Bronc baseball nine and as a lineman on the varsity soccer squad.

Following a Navy tour of duty, Pivovarnick worked briefly in industry, served with the State of New Jersey, and was a recreation leader at Fort Dix before joining the coaching staff of Steinert High School in Hamilton Township, N.J.

At Steinert, where he inaugurated varsity soccer in 1958, his coaching efforts turned out consistent winners over a dozen years—including area conference championships in four of his last five seasons as head mentor. He was also assistant baseball coach at Steinert for eight years.

Named varsity soccer coach and assistant baseball coach at Rider in 1969, Pivovarnick in three seasons of rebuilding has shaped 17 soccer victories. In an 8-5-1 season last year, his booters gained top offensive honors in the tough Middle Atlantic Conference.

## 1972 SOCCER OUTLOOK

The return of Bob Smith and Steve Kerner, this year's co-captains, plus 13 veteran lettermen, should provide the impetus to carry coach Bob Pivovarnick's booters through another winning season in 1972.

The top offensive team in the Middle Atlantic Conference last year (including an 8-5-1 overall record) will be further strengthened by the addition of promising frosh Ross Hart, John Timko, and Dave Gallagher—all from Steinert High's 1971 Group IV State titlists.

Entering his third year as head soccer mentor at Rider, Pivovarnick will look to his sophomore-junior group (the first players he recruited) to provide the necessary experience, proficiency, and leadership in carrying the team over a tough 14-game schedule.

Smith, last year's Most Valuable Player and First Team selection in the MAC, has broken all Bronc scoring records during his three varsity seasons. The team leader and clever ball handler from Trenton is "legitimate All-American material," according to Pivovarnick. Close behind Smith will be senior Steve Kerner, top transfer last season from Mercer County Community College. Voted MVP in 1970's National Junior College Tournament, Kerner's winning attitude, ability, and experience could spell the difference in a close race for the divisional MAC crown.

Junior Wayne Mahan, who played for Pivovarnick as a frosh, and senior Roger Rossano, All-American Honorable Mention at Atlantic Community College in 1970, will be strong varsity candidates as practice sessions begin.

Freshmen Hart, Timko, and Gallagher head a list of promising new talent as coach Pivovarnick looks to the future. With better-than-average speed and ball skills, plus a winning attitude, all three will challenge for varsity berths.

Versatile Mike Picco from Lawrenceville Prep, two-time All-State (All Group) selection, has "the good shot," along with size and speed, to make the squad, according to Pivovarnick. Other top varsity candidates include Jim Kavanaugh, All-State choice last year at Harrison High, Issie Kroll, a halfback from Rutherford, and Ken Rylak, a junior transfer from Quinnipiac College in New Haven, Connecticut.

Approaching the coming season with optimism, coach Pivovarnick believes that if the present offensive momentum continues, and the defense is tightened, the team will be "potentially stronger than last year." The biggest problem facing the 43-year-old Bronc alumnus will be replacing last year's talented goalie, Bob LoMauro. "If we can fill this void, and if the combination of experience and youth becomes cohesive early," he says, "we may have an outstanding season."

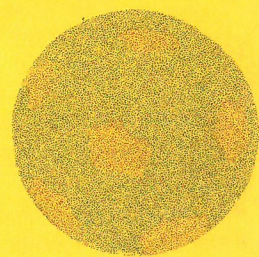

## BOB PIVOVARNICK

Capturing the Middle Atlantic Conference Western Division crown last year and guiding his team to two straight winning seasons highlight Bob Pivovarnick's soccer coaching career at Rider College. Entering his fifth season, the 44-year-old head coach has shaped a 16-11-2 mark the past two years and has developed his squad into the highest scoring eleven in the MAC both those years.

An alumnus of Rider, where he earned both his bachelor and master, he was a standout outfielder on the Bronc baseball team and also a talented lineman on the varsity soccer squad, leading the Bronc booters in scoring in his senior year.

Before coming to Rider, he produced several winning teams during his 12 years as Steinert High's varsity soccer coach — including area conference championships in four of his last five seasons and a share of the State Group IV title in 1967. In 1968, he recorded his 100th scholastic victory. A guidance counselor at Steinert, he also directed the highly successful Bronco Soccer Camp again last summer.

Assisting Pivovarnick as jayvee coach will be Russel J. Fager, now in his third year at Rider.

## 1973 SOCCER OUTLOOK

Replacing last year's senior co-captains, Bob Smith, Rider College's all-everything soccer player, and Steve Kerner, a stellar defensive player, is the task facing Coach Bob Pivovarnick for the 1973 soccer season.

Smith, the Broncs' all-time high scorer, controlled the offense last fall from his center halfback post, and in the process, reaped All-American laurels and became a third-round draft pick of the Philadelphia Atoms. Kerner, operating at fullback, set the defensive pace, and like Smith, was a Middle Atlantic Conference Western Division all-star.

With the loss of those two players from last fall's 8-6-1 team plus the need to find a full-time goaltender, Pivovarnick admits his squad "will be hard pressed to repeat as the MAC West titlist."

But with seven returning lettermen and a talented freshman crop, the Bronc pilot also admits, "We could surprise some people. We're very young, but possess good speed, good ball skills and good knowledge of the game."

Pivovarnick, entering his fifth year as coach, has tabbed three-year veteran, senior Mandje Ivanchukov, and two-year veteran, junior Drew Hires, as his new co-captains. Ivanchukov, a fullback, should bolster an experienced backfield, and Hires should provide consistent play and leadership at halfback.

Soph Jim Kavanaugh (six goals, six assists) and junior Wayne Mahan (MAC West all-star, five goals) give the Broncs experience on the line, while soph Mike Picco, a strong left-footed kicker, probably will be on the left wing. Other leading linemen include Bucknell transfer Tom Petrino, a former Peddie standout, and touted freshmen Marv Wood and Bob Campbell.

Finding the right combination at mid-field now that Smith is gone is one of the keys to a successful season. Besides Hires, possible halfback candidates are junior Bob Higgins and sophs John Timko and Issie Kroll.

The Broncs possess good experience at fullback positions with Ivanchukov and senior Jack McKiernan returning. Juniors Ray Fumo and Ken Rylak also are back after sitting out one year. In addition, Pivovarnick has touted freshman Barry Pelletteri, a standout at St. Anthony High who could step into a starting fullback role.

Last year Pivovarnick used four goalies. This season he would like to find a regular. With the position wide open, he probably will choose his starter from junior letterman Rick Kaplan and freshmen Steve Ginter, Larry Povia and Tom Winchell.

Rider this fall adds St. Peter's College to a rugged 15-game schedule that includes MAC West rivals Bucknell, Delaware, Lehigh, Lafayette and Gettysburg. The Broncs last year won the MAC West with a 4-1 record, but lost to St. Joseph's, 2-0, in the MAC Championship game.

## BOB PIVOVARNICK

Bob Pivovarnick, 45-year-old head soccer coach at Rider College, is entering his sixth season at the helm of the Bronco booters. He has shaped a 33-32-8 career record over his first five years — the last three years on the winning side of the ledger. Over the past three seasons, his teams have posted a 24-17-3 mark.

An alumnus of Rider, where he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees, Pivovarnick is a former Bronco baseball and soccer standout. He led the soccer team in scoring in his senior year.

The veteran mentor also produced consistent winning teams during his 12-year coaching reign at Steinert High School. His Spartans were conference champions in four of his last five seasons and gained a share of the state Group IV title in 1967. The following year he capped his scholastic coaching career with his 100th victory.

A guidance counselor at Steinert, he also has directed the highly successful Bronco Soccer Camps the past three summers.

Russel J. Fager, now in his fourth year at Rider, will again be serving as assistant soccer coach. He is a 1971 graduate of Slippery Rock State College.

## 1974 SOCCER OUTLOOK

Coach Bob Pivovarnick views the 1974 soccer squad with cautious optimism. Although the Broncs are still a young team, Pivovarnick can point to experience and good speed at almost every position.

He will be blessed with 15 returning lettermen — many of them starters from last fall's 8-6-1 team — plus two talented transfers and a promising freshman crop.

With the abundance of experience on the sophomore and junior levels, the veteran coach feels the degree of success his Broncs have this fall hinges upon the development of his goalies, the team's early-season scoring punch, and how fast the defense jells.

He plans to build his squad around tri-captains Drew Hires, a three-year veteran; John Timko, a junior letterman, and Nino DiFiore, a junior transfer from Alderson Broaddus College. Hires and Timko will play key roles in their halfback slots, while DiFiore has the experience and poise to help the Bronc line.

In addition, Pivovarnick looks for the "continued improvement in play" from such lettermen as senior Wayne Mahan, an experienced lineman; senior Tom Petrino, the high scorer with ten goals last year; junior Issie Kroll, a rugged fullback; soph Barry Pelletterri, another solid defensive back, and junior Mike Picco, a two-year vet.

Yet one of the questionable areas is how the Broncs' goalie situation shapes up. Three sophs Tom Winchell, Larry Povia, and Steve Ginter are vying for the starting goaltender's job. Winchell, a starter last fall, saw the most net time, but Povia and Ginter also turned in creditable efforts in their varsity stints.

Most likely, Mahan and Petrino will play important roles as linemen, along with DiFiore and Roland Barnes of Monrovia, Liberia and a transfer from Alfred College. Senior Reg Tucker and sophs Bruce Bartels, Dave Matthews, and Bob Martin also rate as key linemen.

At midfield, besides Hires and Timko, lettermen Bob Higgins and Mary Wills figure prominently as halfbacks as do New Jersey all-state scholastic performers, freshmen Tom Wieboldt and Jim McKeown, a member of the U.S. junior national team this past summer.

Meanwhile, Pelletterri, Kroll, Picco, and senior Ken Rylak are probably front-runners for fullback berths. This foursome, however, will have to contend with junior Ray Fumo, sophs Brian Plushansky, Dennis Motta, and George Boyle, plus freshmen Kevin Doran (also an all-stater), Henry Picatagi or Wieboldt.

The Broncs will encounter a 14-game slate this fall highlighted by a jayvee-varsity twinbill with cross-town rival Trenton State (Oct. 2), a Homecoming Day game with Elizabethtown (Oct. 26), and play in the new East Coast Conference Western Division.

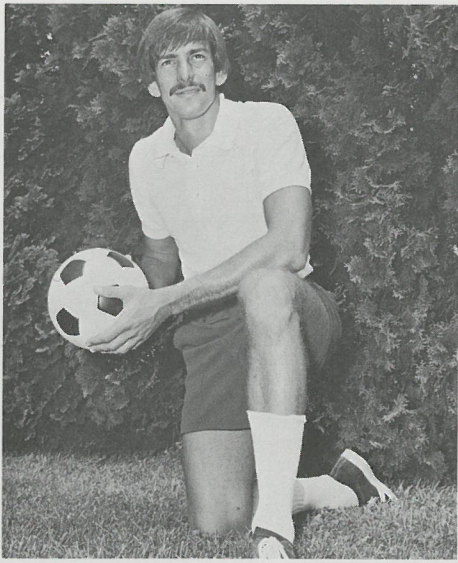

### RUSS FAGER

Russel J. Fager takes over the reins of the Rider soccer program this fall from Bob Pivovarnick, who piloted the Broncs for six years.

Fager, 26, joined the Rider athletic staff in 1971 as an assistant soccer coach and has guided the Broncs' junior varsity arrays the last four seasons. He is the seventh coach in the College's soccer history which dates back to 1933.

A 1971 graduate of Slippery Rock (Pa.) State College, Fager played three years at halfback on the Rockets' soccer teams. In his junior and senior years, he was a first-team selection to the Western Pennsylvania Intercollegiate Athletic Association's all-star squads. As a senior, he was also elected to the 1971 edition of "Outstanding College Athletes of America."

The Ambridge, Pa. native has also served as an assistant athletic trainer and as an assistant to the director of intramural athletics since coming to Rider. He expects to earn his master's degree in guidance and counseling from Rider this year.

### 1975 SOCCER OUTLOOK

For Rider's 1975 soccer team to win this fall, new coach Russ Fager feels a total team effort is a must.

"We don't have one or two exceptional players who can carry a team," Fager said. "What we have are several very good players, who if they play together, have a lot of potential.

"When I say play together, I don't mean just the starters. I plan to use 20 or more players per game, so our bench is important to our success. We need a team effort to win consistently with the schedule we play."

Actually the first-year Bronc pilot has a solid foundation from which to build the team. He has 15 returning lettermen (only five seniors) from last year's 4-8-2 squad and some promising younger players.

The strength of this year's squad will be at halfback and fullback where the Broncs boast their most experience. Senior midfielder John Timko and senior fullback Mike Picco, the 1975 co-captains, each have three years of experience at their respective positions.

In addition, Fager can call on senior Issie Kroll and junior Barry Pelletteri, both two-year veterans, to assist Picco on defense. Most likely, the three will be spelled by reserve fullbacks, junior George Boyle and soph Henry Picatagi.

At midfield, Fager is looking for halfbacks with speed and ability to control the game's tempo. Besides Timko, soph Tom Wieboldt, a lineman last fall, and junior Brian Plushanski, a fullback last fall, figure strongly as halfbacks this season as do senior Nino DiFiore, junior Dennis Motta, sophs Kevin Doran, Pat Trainor and Jim Streich.

Meanwhile, the Bronc goaltenders, juniors Larry Povia and Steve Ginter, have gained adequate experience over the past two seasons. They are so evenly matched it is difficult to pick a starter.

Developing more firepower on the line will be one of Fager's biggest jobs this season. The Broncs' defense yielded only 25 goals last year, but the offense produced just 21.

The line will be young, but aggressive as sophomores and juniors dominate the list of candidates. Sophs Nick Stephan, Jim McKeown, Bill Heins and Ron Wagner all rate strong mention. Each, however, will be pushed by soph Mike Dafgek and juniors Bill Martin, Bruce Bartels and Dave Matthews.

Versatility could become a trademark of the 1975 team. Players like McKeown, Picco, Timko, Pelletteri, Plushanski and Wieboldt have all played other positions in their careers and could switch with relative ease.

Play in the East Coast Conference Western Section against West Chester State, Delaware, Bucknell, Lehigh and Lafayette, plus two night games—one at Mercer Park against rival Trenton State; the other at Rutgers—are features of the rugged, 15-game schedule.

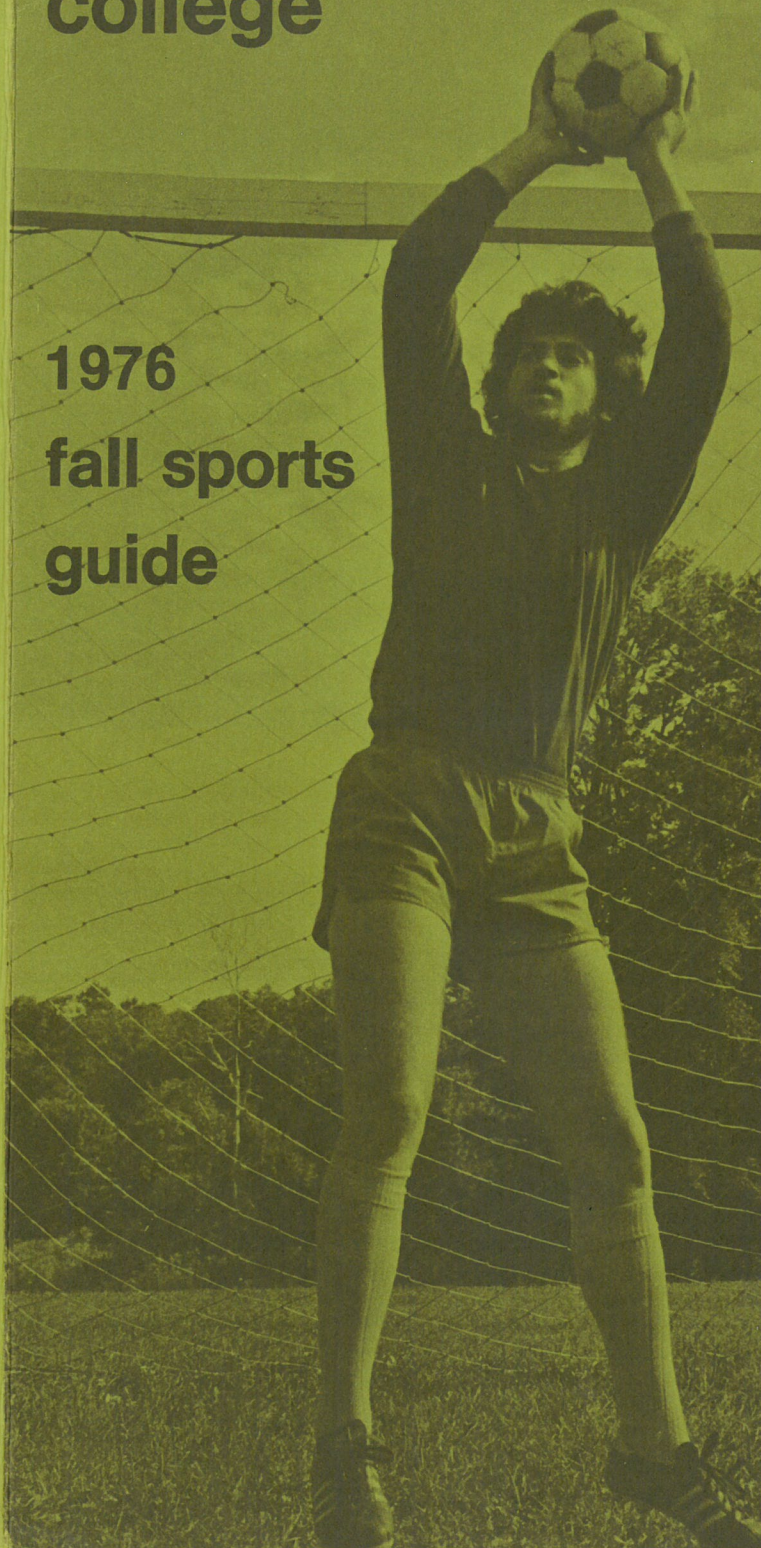

### RUSS FAGER

Russ Fager's first year as Rider's head soccer coach was a marked success.

His Broncs tied the season record of 10 wins, previously set in 1966 and 1968, and just missed capturing the East Coast Conference Championship. He guided his team to the ECC Western Section title via the playoff route when Rider, Delaware, and Bucknell ended the regular season tied for first. The Broncs then lost the league crown to Temple, 1-0.

Fager, 27, joined the Rider athletic staff in 1971 as an assistant soccer coach. He has also served as an assistant athletic trainer and as an assistant to the director of intramural athletics. A 1971 graduate of Slippery Rock (PA) State College, he played three years at halfback for the Rockets and earned first-team honors on the Western Pennsylvania Intercollegiate Athletic Association all-star squads in his junior and senior years.

Rich Giallella, a former Rider soccer and baseball standout, will again assist Fager. An assistant baseball coach in the spring, Giallella last year guided the jayvee booters to a 5-0-1 season.

### SOCCER OUTLOOK

With the loss of conference all-stars Mike Picco, John Timko, Issie Kroll, and reserve Nino DiFiore goes a wealth of soccer experience not easily replenished.

Although Coach Russ Fager will have 14 lettermen and some talented newcomers, he will still have to compensate for the loss of those players if the 1976 Rider team is to duplicate last fall's 10-6-1 record and East Coast Conference Western Section title.

Fager will begin by building his second club around senior tri-captains Barry Pelletteri (halfback), Larry Povia (goalie), and Brian Plushanski (fullback), plus juniors Kevin Doran (halfback), Jim McKeown (sweeper back), Bill Heins (line), and ECC West MVP Tom Wieboldt (line).

Following is a rundown on 1976 personnel:

**Line:** Could be a high-scoring unit, but wing play must improve if offense is to be consistent. Wieboldt, who tied a season record with 16 goals, will anchor the middle of the line and should get good support from Heins, Nick Stephan, Bruce Bartels, and Ron Wagner. Touted freshmen Bob Dunn and Ray English could also be cast in key roles.

**Midfield:** Halfbacks have good speed, experience, and some scoring punch. Center halfback Timko is gone, and emphasis will be placed on improved teamwork. Most likely, Pelletteri, a three-year letterman, will fill the important center halfback slot with Doran, a two-year vet, holding down one of the outside halfback posts. Junior Jim Streich and soph Charlie Viscito will share the other. Freshman Mike Algor also figures strongly in Fager's midfield plans.

**Backfield:** Picco, a four-year performer, and Kroll, a three-year vet, controlled much of the defense from their fullback positions. Sweeper back McKeown and two-year letterman Plushanski will probably assume the defensive leadership. They will be assisted by senior George Boyle, junior Henry Picatagi, and touted freshmen Brian Welsh and Bill Payne.

**Goalkeepers:** Three of Rider's four goalies have lettered and that experience should strengthen the defense around the nets. Povia, because of experience, has the inside track. He played in 16 of 17 games and registered 9.4 saves per game last year. But soph Rich Zimmerman or senior Steve Ginter could nudge Povia out of the job. Soph Gary Ginter, Steve's brother, is also vying for the post.

Overall, if the Broncs are able to take up the slack left by the four players who graduated, it could be a very good year.

The Broncs will be playing a 16-game schedule highlighted by play in the ECC West against Delaware, Bucknell, Lafayette, Lehigh, and West Chester State. Touted squads from Temple, Trenton State, Rutgers, Fairleigh Dickinson, LaSalle, and St. Joseph's also dot the rugged slate.

### RUSS FAGER

A member of Rider's athletic staff since 1971, Russel J. Fager is making his third year as the Broncs' head soccer coach.

The 28-year-old coach came to Rider as an assistant soccer coach and guided the junior varsity squads for four seasons before assuming control of the entire program in 1975. He has also served as the College's assistant athletic trainer and as an assistant to the director of intramural athletics. His 1975 club posted a 10-6-1 record to tie a season mark for victories and to win the East Coast Conference Western Section title. The team then lost the league crown to Temple, 1-0. Last fall the Broncs dipped to 4-9-3 thanks to a rash of early-season injuries.

Fager is a 1971 graduate of Slippery Rock (PA) State College where he played three years as a midfielder for the Rockets. He was named to the All-Western Pennsylvania Intercollegiate Athletic Association first teams in his junior and senior years. He holds a master's degree from Rider.

Assisting Fager again this year will be Rich Giallella, a former Rider soccer and baseball standout. Giallella, who has guided the jayvee booters the last two years, is also the assistant baseball coach in the spring.

### 1977 SOCCER OUTLOOK

It is difficult to predict what the fortunes of the 1977 Rider soccer team will be this year. Much depends on how well the younger players blend with the more experienced performers.

Heading into his third season, Coach Russ Fager will have nine seniors among his 11 returning lettermen which should give the Broncs, 4-9-3 last fall, an adequate nucleus. Yet more than half the squad will be comprised of freshmen and sophomores who still have to prove themselves on the field.

Most likely the backbone of the team will be formed around veteran seniors like halfback Kevin Doran, the team captain; lineman-halfback Bill Heins, fullback Nick Stephan, and fullback-halfback Jim McKeown.

Although the Bronc offense scored just 21 goals last year, Fager feels the defense has to be strengthened if the team is to improve. Last fall defenses lapses hurt considerably as the club played five overtime games into three ties and two losses and three other games into one-goal losses.

Here is a rundown on 1977 personnel:

**Line:** Offense was inconsistent a year ago, but that could change with the experience, returnees gained last fall and with several promising newcomers. Other veteran linemen include Heins, senior Ron Wagner, soph Bob Dunn, and soph Steve Schmier. Mercer County Community College transfer Lou Cortina should be of considerable help. Four 1976 New Jersey High School All-Staters—John Carmignani, Jim Palmere, Tony Ponteri, and John LeGoff—also figure strongly in Fager's plans.

**Midfield:** Should have the ability to move the ball, but again a blend of experience and youth seems to be Fager's formula. Doran, one of the Broncs' most consistent players the last three years, could emerge as an outstanding halfback. At the other two midfield posts, three more outstanding New Jersey scholastic players in Bruce Brodowski, Tony D'Alessandro, and Mark Brady will battle seniors Jamie Streich and Pat Trainor for starting jobs. Heins, Palmere, and fullback Jim McKeown may also see midfield action.

**Backfield:** Also has good depth, but three sophomores and two freshmen are among the top eight players. Sophs Mike Algor and Bill Payne appear primed for strong seasons, while seniors McKeown and Henry Picatagi will bolster the backfield with their experience. Senior Nick Stephan and soph Brian Welsh should also make solid contributions. Frosh Ruben Rivera and Enrico Scardelletti will see varsity game time.

**Goalkeepers:** Juniors Rich Zimmerman and Gary Ginter will battle for the starter's job. Zimmerman has the edge in game experience, but Ginter's spring and winter very capable goalies and both should see a lot of game showings have impressed Fager. In any event, both are very capable goalies and both should see a lot of game time.

### RUSS FAGER

After last year's record-breaking 12-5-1 season and post-season play, Rider soccer coach Russ Fager has clearly maneuvered his team onto the threshold of success.

In two of his three years as Rider's head coach, Fager has guided his Broncs into the East Coast Conference championship game (1975) and into the ECAC Southern Regional Tournament (1977). Both times Temple downed Rider, 1-0 in the title games—last fall's ECAC regional crown taking a marathon four overtime periods to decide. Now Fager, a member of the athletic staff since 1971 and assistant trainer, takes a 26-20-5 record into his fourth season.

Fager is a 1971 graduate of Slippery Rock (PA) State College where he played three years as a midfielder for the Rockets. He was named to the All-Western Pennsylvania Intercollegiate Athletic Association first teams in his junior and senior years. He holds a master's degree from Rider.

Rich Giallella, a former Bronc soccer and baseball standout, will again serve as assistant coach. Also Rider's assistant baseball coach, Giallella has piloted the junior varsity booters to three straight successful seasons.

### 1978 SOCCER OUTLOOK

The return of high scoring senior Tom Wieboldt, the consistency of senior goaltender Rich Zimmerman, the smooth midfield play of sophomores Bruce Brodowski and Jim Palmere, in addition to the return of ten other letter winners, should fuel the Rider College soccer team to a winning season this fall.

But before the Broncs can realize their potential, fourth-year coach Russ Fager must first fill the void left by the departure of all-conference players Jim McKeown (NASL first-round draft pick by Tulsa), Kevin Doran, Bill Heins, and Lou Cortina. These players, along with 1977 seniors Nicky Stephan, Henry Picatagi, and Ron Wagner, keyed Rider to a record-setting 12-win season and a berth in the ECAC Southern Regional Tournament last year.

With only three seniors on the roster, Fager will obviously look to his sophomores and juniors for the right combination. However, he may find some help within a fine crop that includes scholastic all-staters in St. Rose High teammates, John Tallarido and Jim Canning, and North Plainfield's Peter Kepes, plus Hamilton's Mark Meckel, Clifton's Ned Djvkic, and Notre Dame's Frank Nerwinski, Jr.

Although the Broncs have lost three of their four top scorers (Heins, Cortina, McKeown), they will have Palmere, who registered seven goals and five assists as a freshman, and Wieboldt, who tied a record with 16 goals in 1975 and who has 27 for his career. Soph John Carmignani, junior Bob Dunn, and junior Steve Schmier provide speed and experience. Tallarido, who tallied 54 career goals at St. Rose, could make the group that much tougher. Fager also will have solid backups in soph Tony Pontieri, soph John LeGoff, and Djvkic.

Palmere and Brodowski, also an all-league player, give Rider midfield strength. Soph Tony D'Alessandro could be the other starting halfback, but he will be pressed by Canning and Nerwinski. Canning, who with Tallarido paced St. Rose to a 17-2-1 log and a state championship, tabbed ten goals and 20 assists as a senior.

Rider's defense, meanwhile, will be spearheaded by Zimmerman, who could emerge as one of the top goalies the Broncs have had. The team captain played in all 18 games and missed only 71 minutes of action last fall. He averaged seven saves per game, but opponents managed only 13 shots per game thanks to solid backfield play.

Five fullbacks from that group return. They are two-year vet Brian Welsh, juniors Mike Algor and Bill Payne, and sophs Ruben Rivera and Rico Scardelletti. Kepes, who received much all-star recognition at North Plainfield, and Meckel, an all-Mercer County player, should see a lot of action. Senior Gary Ginter, a capable net-minder, will serve as an excellent backup to Zimmerman.

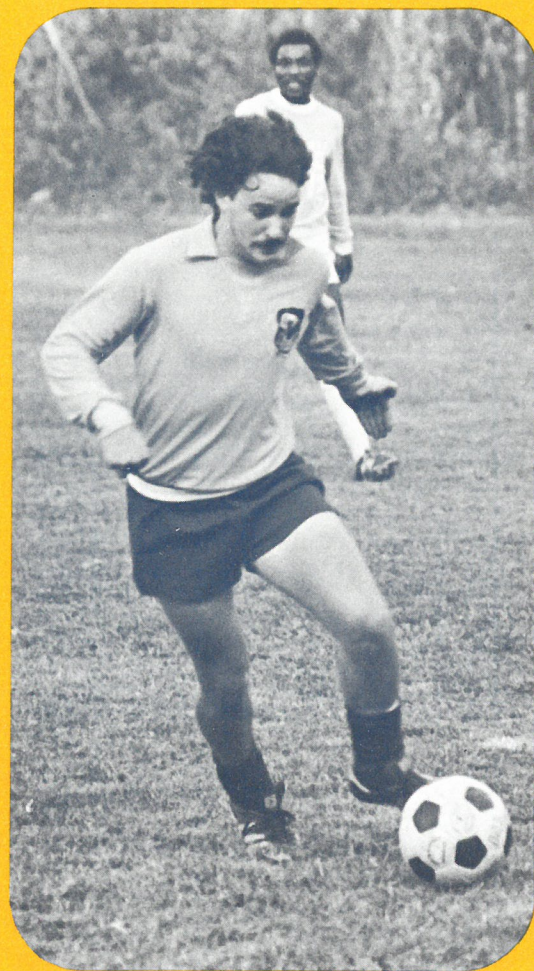

### RUSS FAGER

Russ Fager has guided his Rider soccer teams into two East Coast Conference championship games and into two Eastern College Athletic Conference regional tournaments in his first four years as the Broncs' head coach.

His team fought for the conference title in 1975 and again last year. It earned ECAC post-season bids the last two years. Ironically, Temple University has stopped Rider, 1-0, in three of those games—twice for the league crown and once in a four-overtime game in 1977 ECAC regional play.

Now Fager, who served as Bronc assistant soccer coach from 1971 to 1974, takes a 35-28-6 record into his fifth season with hopes that his club can again play in a post-season tourney. He also is an assistant athletic trainer during the off-season.

### 1979 SOCCER OUTLOOK

The return of 13 lettermen, many with two years of experience, give Rider Soccer Coach Russ Fager reason to be optimistic this fall.

Yet he cautions that the team must stay healthy, must get consistent play from its veterans, and must have some of its newcomers contribute to have a third straight winning season and a third straight, post-season tournament bid.

Overall, the Broncs (9-8-1 in an injury-filled 1978 season that included a conference championship game and ECAC tourney competition) look strong offensively and defensively. East Coast Conference all-stars Jim Palmere, Bruce Brodowski, and Ruben Rivera, plus junior John Carmignani and seniors Brian Welsh, Mike Algor, Bob Dunn, and Steve Schmier give Rider a solid nucleus.

A rundown of 1979 personnel:

**Line:** Broncs' lose Philadelphia Fury draft pick Tom Wieboldt, the ECC's highest scorer with 12 goals and six assists last fall, but still boast ample experience up front. Dunn has played in over 40 games, Carmignani 36 straight, Schmier and junior Tony Pontieri in over 20 apiece. And Lou Cortina (a 1977 all-ECC player) could make Rider's attack explosive if he can return from an injury. Fager also has some talented freshmen in all-stater Adolf Marisi, all-Long Islander Jeff Schmier (Steve's brother), Bill Kirby, Tom Tuffy, and Charlie Chiappone.

**Midfield:** Brodowski, twice an all-league player, and Palmere, 1979 team captain, have started 36 consecutive games. That experience should help the two juniors control the offense this year. Junior Tony D'Alessandro could play a wing along with Palmere. Soph Frank Nerwinski, freshman Steve Fogler, and freshman Terry Guld give the team excellent depth.

**Backfield:** Defense could be Rider's Strong point. It was good a year ago and should get better with age this season. Rivera, seniors Brian Welsh, Bill Payne, and Mike Algor make it that way. So do sophs Jim Canning and Pete Kepes. Rico Scardelletti, a junior who has battled injuries his first two seasons, has the talent to be a starter.

**Goaltenders:** The biggest injury the Broncs encountered last fall came when Rich Zimmerman was lost after the third game with torn ligaments in his knee. John Gallagher, now a senior, filled in well and handled the pressure of replacing "Zim" well. Those 14 starts make him the front runner for the goalies' job this year, but two very talented freshman netminders—Tom Mackin and Bill Ireland—will push him hard for the assignment.

The Broncs' schedule is demanding. It begins with Princeton in the Trenton State tournament and includes the likes of Temple, Rutgers, Delaware, Loyola of Baltimore, Lehigh, LaSalle, and Lafayette. If everything breaks right, Rider could experience a very good year.
